ABARE FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by David, Class of 1987 and Kim Abare, to be awarded to a student within or entering the Corps of Cadets with a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale and demonstrated financial need. Preference is for a student from the North Shore, Boston area, and secondary preference to students from Massachusetts.

GEORGE I. ALDEN TRUST SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1985, the Alden Trust Scholarship was created to encourage students in Associate Degree programs to continue their education in bachelor's degree programs studying elementary or secondary school teaching, science, or mathematics.

FLOYD W. AND FRANCES G. ALTORFER SCHOLARSHIP

Established as a loan fund in 1963 and converted to an endowed scholarship fund in 1990. Awarded to a sophomore, junior, or senior majoring in mechanical engineering. The student does not have to be an academic leader at the time of the award but should be a student who has shown steady improvement in academic performance and shows promise of being the best student in the program. The student should be of good standing and personal character.

ANCIENT AND HONORABLES SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2014, this scholarship is first awarded to students that are self-identified descendants of the Ancients and Honorable Company of Massachusetts members. If no students are identified, this scholarship may then be awarded to a student with financial need.

SSG HILBERT E. ANDERSON AND CPT ROBERT H. ANDERSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2022, by Alan M. Anderson M'09 and his spouse, Ann M. Anderson, in honor of Alan's father, SSG Hilbert E. Anderson, and his uncle, CPT Robert H. Anderson, and their service to our country during World War II. Each of them was wounded in action three times. The scholarship is to be awarded to presently serving, or honorably discharged veterans, of the United States Armed Forces. Preference for awarding the scholarship shall be given to possible recipients in the following order: Recipients of the Purple Heart Medal of the United States, within this category, preference shall be given first, to individuals disabled as a result of their wounds received in action; second, to individuals who have received more than one award of the Purple Heart Medal; individuals who received the Combat Infantryman Badge, Combat Medical Badge, Combat Action Badge, Combat Action Ribbon, or the equivalent award for participation in actual combat against an enemy of the United States from their respective branch of service; individuals who are presently serving in the Armed Forces of the United States, who are in need of funding to timely complete an undergraduate degree completion program. If no student meets any of the above criteria, then the University may, in its discretion, award the scholarship to a qualified veteran or hold the scholarship in abeyance until such time as a student meets the criteria.

PAUL REVERE ANDREWS '30 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1975 by Paul Revere Andrews, Class of 1930, and longtime trustee of Norwich University as a general scholarship.

VIRGINIA PRENTICE ETTINGER ANDREWS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1980 by Paul R. P. Andrews, Class of 1973, originally in honor of, now in memory of his mother, Virginia Ettinger Andrews. Paul R. P. Andrews' father was Paul Revere Andrews. The recipient should be a woman, junior or senior, in the Corps of Cadets, and a humanities major.

COL BERTRAM B. ARMSTRONG, USA (RET.) '74 AND ANDREA T. GREEN-ARMSTRONG SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 in loving memory of COL Armstrong's parents LtCol (Ret.) Bennie and Mrs. Ivory Armstrong of Haverhill and Tewksbury, MA, the scholarship is awarded to minority student(s) who demonstrate financial need, are a member of the Corps of Cadets, have a GPA between 2.25 and 3.0, from any country, state or territory and pursuing any academic major.

BRIAN '68 AND SANDRA ASHE SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Brian, Class of 1968, and Sandra Ashe with a planned gift. The scholarship is awarded to members of the Norwich University Corps of Cadets who demonstrate financial need and is renewable provided the recipient maintains a GPA of 2.75. Preference is given to members of the Corps of Cadets who are Eagle Scouts, however, if no Eagle Scout is identified, the scholarship will be awarded based upon the initial criteria.

VICTOR AND HILDA AUERBACH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by Gabe Auerbach, Class of 1961, in honor of his parents, Hilda and Victor Auerbach. This scholarship is awarded to a member of the Corps of Cadets with demonstrated need. The order of priority for the award will be first, a student from Brooklyn, second, a student from New York City, and third, a student from New York State. If these criteria cannot be met, a student from Massachusetts will receive the award. The scholarship is renewable annually.

JONATHAN BAKER, CLASS OF 1824 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1933 by the will of Mrs. Nellie Baker Smith of Charlestown, New Hampshire, in memory of her father, Jonathan Baker, Class of 1924. Scholarships are awarded to needy and worthy students.

PERLEY BAKER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1987 in memory of Perley D. Baker, Professor of Chemistry, to be awarded to students in the chemistry program.

BAUMANN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2019 by Philipp '86, M'14 and Kimberly '87 Baumann P'19, a later joined by their daughter Katelyn '19, the scholarship is awarded to students who are members of the Corps of Cadets and enrolled in a mathematics or engineering program.

BEAUDOIN-KNOX MEMORIAL FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established for students who are members of the Corps of Cadets who maintain a minimum GPA of 2.75. Preference is given to students active in either the Army ROTC or Air Force ROTC programs and from the regions of Western Massachusetts or Northern New York (north of Albany and as far west as Buffalo). For awarding purposes, counties included in Western Massachusetts are Berkshire, Franklin, Hampshire, and Hampden. Counties included in northern New York are Albany, Cayuga, Chenango, Clinton, Erie, Essex, Franklin, Fulton, Genesee, Hamilton, Herkimer, Jefferson, Lewis, Livingston, Madison, Monroe, Montgomery, Niagara, Oneida, Onondaga, Ontario, Orleans, Otsego, Oswego, Saratoga, Schenectady, Schoharie, Seneca, St. Lawrence, Warren, Wayne, and Wyoming.

WENDELIN J. BECK SCHOLARSHIP

Established in memory of Wendelin J. Beck in 1994 by his son, Robert W. Beck, Class of 1942, with a gift from Robert's estate. The scholarship is to be awarded to students studying engineering who are also enrolled in ROTC.

MARY PEROLINI AND REGINA BELLINZIER SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Mary L. Bellinzier in 2016, in loving memory of her mother Regina Bellinzier and aunt, Mary Perolini. The donor prefers this scholarship be awarded to a student(s) majoring in Nursing.

RICHARD L. BERKMAN '69, PE, CDR, USN SCHOLARSHIP

Established 2021, in memory of CDR Berkman's parents, Saul and Agusta Berkman, and his classmates, LT Richard Gray '69, USA, Arty (KIA Vietnam) and LT Paul Halkovich '69, USA, OrdC, who died in the line of duty. The scholarship is to be awarded to members of the Corps of Cadets who are majoring in one of the engineering disciplines. Preference is given to those who plan to serve in one of the uniformed services of the United States. The student(s) selected must demonstrate financial need.

EDWIN J. '51 AND THELMA I. '51 BEYERL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2014 by Edwin J., Class of 1951 and Thelma I., Class of 1951. The scholarship is awarded to students who are active members of the Corps of Cadets.

BRIAN R. BILL '01 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2011, by friends and family of Brian Bill, Class of 2001. 75% of the annual disbursement will be allocated to traditional, undergraduate members of the Corps of Cadets with preference given to students in the following order; first to a member of the Corps of Cadets who is a son or daughter of a former Navy SEAL or other member of the U.S. Armed Services Special Forces; second preference is to a member of the civilian student body who is a son or daughter of a former Navy SEAL or other member of the U.S. Armed Services Special Forces; third preference is to students who have a demonstrated interest in becoming a Navy SEAL; and lastly it may be awarded to students who are members of the Corps of Cadets. The remaining 25% of the annual disbursement will be allocated to Navy SEALs or other members of the U.S. Armed Services Special Operations Forces who are enrolled through one of Norwich University's degree completion programs through the College of Graduate and Continuing Studies.

GERALD ADAMS BIXBY '18 AND WALTER THOMAS MCHUGO SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1982 in memory of Gerald Adams Bixby, Class of 1918, and Walter Thomas McHugo by their children Patricia Bixby McHugo and John McHugo, Class of 1945. The scholarship is awarded to students enrolled in the Corps of Cadets with preference given to residents of Vermont.

MELVIN F. BOOMER '33 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1991 by a bequest from the estate of Melvin F. Boomer, Class of 1933, for the benefit of students with demonstrated financial need.

FRANCIS X. BRENNAN '64 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2019, by Maureen Manley Brennan in memory of her husband, "Franny", to be awarded annually to members of the Corps of Cadets who will commission in one of the branches of armed forces or enter into public service upon degree completion. This scholarship is open to all majors. The student(s) selected must demonstrate financial need.

BROCKWAY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1957 by the will of Blanche Emily Brockway of Montpelier, Vermont. The recipient must be from Vermont.

BROX FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1998 by Colonel Charles A. Brox, Jr. USAR (Ret.), Class of 1957, his wife, Carolyn, their daughters, Sharon L. Brox and Kathleen Brox Welsh, Class of 1984, and their son-in-law, Robert W. Welsh, Jr., class of 1985. The Brox Family Scholarship is to be awarded to students who have a positive impact on the college community through involvement in meaningful campus and community activities.

RICHARD BRUNI '83 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1981 by Mr. and Mrs. Archi Bruni in memory of their son, Richard L. Bruni, Class of 1983. Richard was a Platoon Sergeant of A Company and holder of the Distinctive GMC Cadet Ribbon.

WILLIAM "POP" BRYAN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1983 by Alfred L. "Tom" Howes, Class of 1966, in honor of William A. "Pop" Bryan, Professor of Geography, to be awarded to earth science majors.

JUDGE THADDEUS BUCZKO '47, H'96 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by Thaddeus Buczko, Class of 1947. Preference will be given to students from Salem, Massachusetts, then from Essex County, and then to a resident of Massachusetts. The student must show a demonstrated financial need.

BUCZKO FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016, this scholarship is awarded to students who are currently enrolled in any of the ROTC branches at Norwich University. This scholarship may be renewed on an annual basis through the student's senior year as long as the student remains in good academic standing.

MARSHA A. BUDNICK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2020 by Lawrence J. Budnick, Jr. '64 in honor of his wife, this scholarship is to be awarded to a student(s) who is a junior or senior and a member of the Corps of Cadets that demonstrates high financial need.

BUGLER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2006 by Donald I., Class of 1952, and Barbara L. Richmond, preference of this scholarship is first given to a member of the Corps of Cadets in the marching band who specializes in military calls using a bugle or trumpet. If the first preference is not available, preference will be given to any member of the marching band or other Norwich musical organizations. Third preference will be given to students who are members of the Corps of Cadets.

CLARKE S.P. BUNTING '33 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by Tim Mellon in memory of his uncle, Clarke S. P. Bunting, Class of 1933, who served as a Trustee of the University from 1977-2001. The scholarship will be awarded annually to a student in the Corp of Cadets over the four-year course of his or her enrollment. Preference will be given to students from Missouri or Kansas who maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.5 with demonstrated financial need.

CHARLES R. BURD '51 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1989 by his wife, Martha Burd, family, friends, and classmates in memory of Charles R. Burd, Class of 1951, as a general scholarship.

MARK '70 & ALLYN CALLAHAN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established 2020, by Mark '70 and Allyn Callahan, this scholarship is awarded to a junior Corps of Cadets member, with special consideration given to a student participating in the Marine Platoon Leaders Course. The scholarship may be renewed providing the student is in good academic standing. If the first preference cannot be met, the scholarship may be awarded to a student who is a participating in Naval ROTC and in good academic standing. The student(s) selected must demonstrate financial need.

CAMPBELL HISTORY SCHOLARSHIP

Established for students majoring in history.

COL ANTHONY J. CARBONE '58 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1998 by gifts from family, alumni, and friends in honor of Colonel Anthony J. Carbone, Class of 1958. Preference will be given to cadets who intend to join one of the Armed Forces and demonstrate financial need.

DANIEL M. CARR '67 AND DANIEL E. CARR '37 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by Daniel M. Carr, Class of 1967, in memory of his father, Daniel E. Carr, Class of 1937. The scholarship is awarded to cadets entering their junior year participating in a commissioning program in one of the branches of the armed forces. The scholarship will not be awarded to students who already have a ROTC scholarship. Juniors can also receive the scholarship in their senior year, as long as they plan on being commissioned in one of the branches of the armed forces. Financial need is a preference.

ROBERT H. AND MARY F. CHASTNEY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1996 by a bequest from the estate of Mary F. Chastney in memory of Dr. Robert Chastney, a long-standing friend of General Harmon, for the benefit of students with a demonstrated financial need.

ROBERT S. CHILTON '73 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2019, in memory of Robert S. Chilton Sr., Mary Jane Chilton, Gene (Monk) Finnell and Edna Finnell. The scholarship is to be awarded to student(s) who are members of the Norwich University Corps of Cadets, are in good academic standing and demonstrate high financial need. The scholarship may be renewed each year for students who continue to meet the criteria.

CHARLES CHRISTY '57 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2000 by the Security Federal Savings Bank in honor of Charles P. Christy, Class of 1957, and former President of the bank. The scholarship is awarded on the basis of academic merit to a student from Brockton or Falmouth, Massachusetts, the communities in which the bank's offices are located. If no student from either of these two communities attends, the scholarship shall be awarded to a student from Barnstable or Plymouth Counties, Massachusetts.

CLASS OF 1929 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1983 by R. Avery Robinson, Class of 1929, in memory of his class as a general scholarship.

HORSEMEN OF '42 SCHOLARSHIP

Established for students in the Corps of Cadets with good academic standing and demonstrated financial need. Preference is given to students who do not have a ROTC scholarship and exhibit an outstanding aptitude for military service. Preference is also given to students who have an interest in the cavalry and history of Norwich University.

CLASS OF 1959 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1995 by the Class of 1959 in honor of their class. This scholarship is awarded to only one student each year who demonstrates financial need, is a member of the Corps of Cadets, in good academic standing, and who has demonstrated leadership skills. Preference is also given to students who are lineal descendants of the class.

CLASS OF 1960 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 by the Class of 1960, this scholarship is awarded to an incoming freshman. First preference for this scholarship is given to lineal descendants of the Class of 1960 who are in the Corps of Cadets. Second preference is given to lineal descendants of the Class of 1960 who are civilian students. If the first or second priority is not available, this scholarship may be awarded to students in the Corp of Cadets. The scholarship will be renewed through the student's senior year.

CLASS OF 1961 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2006 by the Class of 1961 in honor of their class. This scholarship is awarded to students in the Corps of Cadets who have demonstrated financial need.

CLASS OF 1962 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2012 in honor of the Class of 1962 on their 50th reunion, this scholarship is awarded annually to one or more students who demonstrate financial need with a grade point average of 2.5 or better. Preference will be given to students who are lineal descendants of the Class of 1962.

CLASS OF 1963 SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Class of 1963 in honor of their class. The scholarship is awarded to a senior in the Corps of Cadets who has financial need and good academic standing. Preference will be given to lineal descendants or cadets sponsored by members of the class. In addition, preference may be given to direct lineal descendants of the Class of 1963 who are civilian students, if they meet the requirements of the scholarship.

CLASS OF 1964 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2015 by Lawrence Budnick, Class of 1964, this scholarship is awarded annually to students who are members of the Corps of Cadets and are enrolled in an engineering program.

BOYZ OF '66 SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Class of 1966 in honor of their class. The scholarship is awarded to a senior in the Corps of Cadets who has demonstrated financial need and good academic standing. Preference is given to lineal descendants or cadets sponsored by members of the class.

CLASS OF 1966 VIETNAM VETERANS' MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2000 by George Underhill, Class of 1966, his wife, Lucia Underhill, Class of 1966 and their daughter, Josephine Underhill, Class of 1996, and family, to commemorate the service of the Vietnam Veterans of the Class of 1966. Preference will be given to two members of the Corps of Cadets, juniors or seniors or one of each, with demonstrated financial need.

CLASS OF 1967 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2007 by members of the Class of 1967 in honor of their class, this scholarship is awarded to a sophomore, junior, or senior students who are members of the Corps of Cadets. Preference is given to students who are lineal descendants of the Class of 1967. The student must have a GPA of 2.0 or better, demonstrate financial need and be an active participant in campus activities.

CLASS OF 1970 FREEDOM SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2015 by the Class of 1970, the scholarship is awarded annually to students who are active members of the Corps of Cadets, who hold a minimum GPA of 2.75. Preference is given to students who make a meaningful contribution to Norwich University through their leadership within the Corps of Cadets and accomplishments in Norwich University's extracurricular activities. The scholarship is renewable, provided the student continues to meet the criteria. The Donors prefer that this scholarship award cover a substantial amount for one deserving student. Additional monies remaining after that student is awarded may then be distributed to one or more additional students.

CLASS OF 1971 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by the Class of 1971 on their 50th reunion to honor deceased classmates, the scholarship is to be awarded to one or more full-time undergraduate student(s) who are entering their sophomore, junior or senior year, maintain a GPA of 2.75,

have demonstrated financial need and exemplify our guiding value of “service to nation and others before self”, demonstrate leadership, academic excellence and engagement in extracurricular activities. The scholarship is renewable should the student(s) continue to meet the criteria.

CLASS OF 1971 JACK STRICOS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2006 through the generosity of his classmates and friends to honor Jack Stricos, Class of 1971, on the occasion of their 35th reunion, this scholarship is awarded to one or more students in the Corps of Cadets who exemplifies the characteristics that Jack presented throughout his time at Norwich. Preference of the scholarship will be given to a student who has demonstrated leadership, academic excellence, and participation in extracurricular activities. The scholarship is renewable through the senior year of the student(s).

CLASS OF 1972 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by the Class of 1972 to be awarded to students with demonstrated financial need or to lineal descendants of the class. In the case of lineal descendants applying for this scholarship, the lineal descendants will receive preference.

CLASS OF 1974 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by the Class of 1974. This scholarship is awarded to members of the Corps of Cadets who demonstrate financial need.

CLASS OF 1980 COL JAMES MOORE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 by the Class of 1980 and the Moore Family with the support of Colonel Moore’s many friends. Scholarships are awarded to juniors in the Corps of Cadets who demonstrate qualities of character and leadership.

CLASS OF 1984 SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Class of 1984 and awarded annually to an upperclassman in the Corps of Cadets. Preference for this scholarship is given to students who demonstrate a “Strive for Excellence” attitude marked by involvement or leadership in extracurricular activities or organizations either on or off campus that have a positive impact on the Norwich community. This scholarship may be renewed through the student’s senior year if a minimum of a 2.5 grade point average is maintained.

CLASS OF 1986 SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Class of 1986 and awarded to students with preference given to lineal descendants of the Class of 1986. In the event there are no lineal descendants identified, this scholarship is then awarded to students with demonstrated financial need. This scholarship is renewable through the student’s senior year, provided the student remains in good academic standing.

CLASS OF 1990 ROB SOLTES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by the classmates, friends, and family of Dr. Charles Robert Soltes, Class of 1990, killed in action in Iraq. The scholarship is awarded to a student in the Corps of Cadets.

CLASS OF 1992 DUCHENE/MALPERE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by the friends, family, and classmates of Jerry DuChene, Class of 1992 and Art Malpere, Class of 1992, this scholarship is awarded to outstanding leaders of the Corps of Cadets who plan to commission with the United States Marine Corps. Preference for this scholarship is given to students who demonstrate a commitment to, and are engaged in, community service activities.

ELIZABETH GOOD COMOLLI SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1989 by Joseph C. Comolli in memory of his wife, Elizabeth Good Comolli of Montpelier, Vermont. The scholarship is awarded annually to nursing students; preference is given to persons born in Vermont or residents of the state.

CLEMENT J. CONFESSORE LEADERSHIP AWARD

Established in 2002 by Diane Confessore and her sons, Clement R. Confessore, Class of 1958, and Gary Confessore, Class of 1963, in memory of M/SGT Clement J. Confessore, Veteran of the European and Pacific Theatres, WWII, and the Korean Conflict. Preference is given to the Cadet who demonstrated the best leadership skills as a First Sergeant in the Corps of Cadets during the previous year. This cadet is chosen annually by the Commandant of Cadets. The cadet will be awarded a scholarship (applied toward his or her tuition) and will be presented with a pair of gold-plated spurs—mirroring the style once used by the United States Army—during Homecoming.

JUSTIN '91 & CORINE CONNORS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2020, by Justin '91 and Corine Connors, this scholarship is awarded to student in the Corps of Cadets with special consideration given to student from Central Florida. Students must demonstrate financial need.

HARRY B. CORRIGAN, D.D.S. SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1993 by family, friends, and Norwich alumni in memory of Dr. Harry B. Corrigan. The scholarship is awarded to students who are juniors or seniors in the Corps of Cadets who have actively participated in the Corps leadership and who have maintained high academic standing.

ROBERT F. CRECCO '47 COMMUNICATIONS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2006 by Robert F. Crecco, Class of 1947, this scholarship is awarded to one civilian student and one Corps of Cadets student annually. Students should be a junior or senior, who are actively engaged within the Communications major. Preference will be given to students who actively participate on the student newspaper. This scholarship may be renewed through the student's senior year.

MARTHA B. CURRIE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 through the will of Ellen C. Hill in memory of her mother, Martha B. Currie and the Montpelier Seminary Class of 1909, to provide scholarships for students majoring in nursing.

MG ROBERT J. '58 AND ROSALYN R. DACEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2008 through the estate planning of Robert, Class of 1958 and Rosalyn Dacey, this scholarship is awarded annually to a member of the Corps of Cadets on the basis of academic promise and who is enrolled in a ROTC program. Preference of this scholarship is first given to students who reside in Watertown, New York. If no student from Watertown, New York is available, this scholarship may then be given to a student from Northern New York (north of the Rochester-Syracuse-Albany line). If neither regional preference can be met, the scholarship may be given to a student deemed worthy by the Office of Financial Aid.

ROBERT E. DAKIN, P.E. '71 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2019, in memory of Robert E. Dakin, P.E '71, by his widow, Maureen Dakin, friends and family. The scholarship is awarded to female members of the Corps of Cadets who are majoring in Electrical Engineering, the course of study pursued by Robert Dakin. Students must demonstrate financial need.

PETER F. DALTON '65 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2011 by John A. Dalton, to honor the memory of his father. This scholarship is awarded to students who are members of the Corps of Cadets. The students must be majoring in business.

SIMON W. DANFORTH '63 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016 by Leonard N. Palmer, Class of 1963, in honor of his friend and classmate Simon W. Established in 2013 by Arthur, Class of 1952, and June Davidson. This scholarship is awarded to students who are active in the Corps of Cadets. The donor also prefers that this scholarship first is awarded to students whose major is civil engineering and then to those majoring in any engineering curriculum.

LINDLEY I. DEAN '11 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1956 by Edith J. Dean in memory of her husband, Lindley I. Dean, Class of 1911. The scholarship is awarded annually to freshmen or sophomore students from Massachusetts, with preference to students in the Corps of Cadets from Essex County, who demonstrate financial need, a promise of success, scholarship, and character.

DEARING SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established in 1987 in memory of George Emerson Dearing by bequests from Arthur Allen Dearing and Evelyn Cooper Dearing for scholarship funds to students at Norwich University.

ALAN '75 AND CYNTHIA '75 DEFOREST NURFC SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 with a challenge gift from Alan, Class of 1975, and Cynthia, Class of 1975, DeForest, along with gifts from former players and friends of the Norwich Rugby Club. Scholarships are awarded to one or more incoming students who actively participate in the

Norwich University Rugby Club. The scholarship may be renewed for students who continue to participate in rugby.

LENA (MCGRATH) AND EUGENE C. DENOFRIO SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2020, by Col. David M. DeNorfio, USAF '84 in memory of his parents, the scholarship is awarded to students who are active members of the Corps of Cadets. Preference of this scholarship is given to students from Aroostook County, Maine or Franklin County, Massachusetts. If those preferences cannot be met, this scholarship may then be awarded to a student majoring in an Engineering curriculum.

DEMOVICK FAMILY ENDOWMENT

Established in 2009 by Harvey, Class of 1968 and Jeanne DeMovick, to have a direct and positive impact on students and faculty within the School of Math and Sciences. This endowment is awarded annually to three students who have the highest cumulative grade point average following their junior year. Students must be enrolled in the following academic majors to be a recipient of this award; mathematics, nursing, and one of the true sciences (chemistry, biology, physics, and geology).

DENNY FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1899 by the terms of the will of Chauncey Denny, Trustee of Norwich University from 1890 until 1899. Mr. Denny was born in Berlin, Vermont and moved to Northfield in 1847. A century later, the Denny family continues to support this scholarship. Preference is to be given to any worthy student with a demonstrated financial need from Northfield, Vermont.

DE OPPRESSO LIBER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016, this scholarship is awarded to Enlisted and Warrant Officer US Army Special Forces (SF) Soldiers in Career Management Field 18/180 who are enrolled in any of the Bachelor's or Master's programs available at Norwich University's College of Graduate and Continuing Studies (CGCS) to assist with Norwich's online academic expenses not covered by the US Army Tuition Assistance Program. Students considered for the scholarship will be in high academic standing with a minimum 3.0 GPA and good military standing.

DANIEL R. DESROCHERS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established in 2002, this scholarship will assist a deserving student from the State of New Hampshire, taking classes in or seeking a major from the Department of Biology and Life Sciences within the College of Science and Mathematics. The recipient should also participate in community service activities.

ROBERT H. DOLE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1969 by the will of Henriette F. Dole in memory of her husband, Robert H. Dole, to assist deserving students who otherwise might not be able to obtain the advantage of a college education. Mr. Dole was the nephew of former Norwich President Charles Dole, Class of 1869.

GEORGE F. DONOVAN '61 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1993 by Trustee George F. Donovan, Class of 1961, to be awarded based on need with preference given to engineering students.

JOSEPH N. DOYLE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by Allen, Class of 1971 and Kate Doyle in honor of his father, Joseph N. Doyle. Preference will be given to students from the greater Boston area or the state of Massachusetts who maintain a 2.5 minimum GPA.

1LT MARK H. DOOLEY '01 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2020, in memory of 1LT Mark H. Dooley '01, who was killed in action in Iraq. The scholarship is to be awarded to a student(s) in the Corps of Cadets who is majoring in criminal justice, studies in war & peace, history or political science. Preference is given to students who plan to serve in the military or law enforcement. The student(s) must be a United States Citizen and show demonstrated financial need.

DRECHSEL FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 by Colonel Carl Drechsel, USAR (Ret.), Class of 1967, and wife Sandra Drechsel. Preference is given to students within or entering the Corps of Cadets majoring in engineering, math, or science with demonstrated financial need. Preference will be given to students from the State of Texas and/or have family members that are veterans or are currently serving in the United States Military. Students must maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher. The scholarship will be renewed on an annual basis through the student's senior year as long as the student maintains a GPA not less than 3.0.

DUTTON FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by the estate of Paul B. Dutton of Northfield, Vermont in memory of his wife, Irene C. Dutton, and his mother, Effie D. Dutton. The scholarship is awarded to a member of the Corps of Cadets with demonstrated financial need.

ARTHUR EDMUNDS '16 AND EVERETT W. MARSDEN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by the will of Arthur D. Edmunds, Class of 1916 as a general scholarship.

SLIM FELLOWS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1990 by the will of Harold C. Fellows, Class of 1914. Preference will be given to students from Laconia, New Hampshire.

TSGT WARREN E. FENCL, USAF (RET.) SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by the Officers and Members of the American Legion Somerville Post 19, the scholarship is to be awarded to two sophomores, juniors or seniors in the Corps of Cadets who have demonstrated financial need. The scholarship is for students who are United States citizens who intend to or are currently serving in the military. Preference is given first to students from Somerville, MA, then to students from Arlington, Cambridge, Charlestown, Medford and Watertown, MA, then to students from the state of Massachusetts. The scholarship is renewable if the criteria continues to be met.

CSM KEITH J. FILIPP '12 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2019 by Linda Miller in memory of her husband, CSM Keith J. Filipp '12. The scholarship is to be awarded to a junior or senior student(s) that demonstrates financial need, academic success and is enrolled in the Bachelor of Science in Strategic Studies and Defense Analysis through the College of Graduate and Continuing Studies (CGCS). Should the Bachelor of Science in Strategic Studies and Defense Analysis no longer exist, the scholarship should be awarded to an undergraduate student from the state of Texas who plans to commission or enlist in the United States Armed Forces.

FIRE BRIGADE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1985 in memory of David Lee Anderson, Matthew R. Baran, and Patrick de Kramer, and awarded to a student of good character who has shown interest in the university and community service.

JOSEPH AND GUNNY FOWLER SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established in 2003 by Colonel Joseph G. Fowler. Scholarships are awarded to one or more deserving students who are members of the Norwich University Corps of Cadets.

JACOB M. FREUDENTHAL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016 by Thomas S. Freudenthal, Class of 1983 and Ines M. Montalvo P'08, this scholarship is first awarded to student(s) who are members of the Norwich University Corps of Cadets, majoring in nursing, and are either a Norwich University legacy student, or current military member or veteran; second preference is to student(s) who are members of the Corps of Cadets, majoring in nursing; third preference is to civilian student(s) who are active in a ROTC program and majoring in nursing.

GARDEN STATE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by Harry Sholk, Class of 1952. Preference is given to a student from New Jersey who is a member of the Corps of Cadets. The scholarship is awarded to an incoming freshman who has demonstrated financial need and who exemplifies a belief in diversity and in the intrinsic worth of all persons. It may be renewed for three consecutive years provided the student maintains a GPA of not less than 2.5.

ALFRED '53 AND JANET GARDNER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by Alfred S. Gardner, Class of 1953 and his wife, Janet W. Gardner, the scholarship is awarded annually to a student(s) majoring in an engineering discipline. The student(s) must be a member of the Corps of cadets and shall exhibit a high degree of devotion to the Corps and to the University.

LTC GEORGE A. '42 AND NANCY M. GARRISON SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 by the Garrison Family in memory of George Garrison, Class of 1942 and to honor a lifetime of service to Norwich University by George and his wife Nancy. This scholarship is awarded to an incoming freshman in the Corps of Cadets who has demonstrated a financial need and exemplifies a belief in the value of education. The scholarship will be renewed on an annual basis through the student's senior year as long as the student maintains a GPA not less than 2.5.

LTC RITCHIE GARRISON '37 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1988 by Colonel Garrison and others of the Class of 1937. Scholarships are awarded to members of the Corps of Cadets.

SAMUEL AND SUE GELLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2000 by James, Class of 1959, and Eileen Geller in memory of Mr. Geller's parents, Samuel and Sue Geller. This scholarship assists students who might not otherwise be able to obtain the advantage of a college education. Awarded to a freshman in the Corps of Cadets with demonstrated financial need, acceptable academic standards and a singular redeeming virtue in a specific field of endeavor or extracurricular activity. The scholarship will

be renewed on an annual basis through the student's senior year as long as the criteria for the award continues to be met.

WILLIAM M. GIBSON M'07 AVIATION SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2020, by William M. Gibson M'07, the scholarship is to be awarded to a student(s) with demonstrated financial need who plans on pursuing a career in commercial or military aviation as a pilot or crew member. Preference given to a student(s) who is a member of the Corps of Cadets.

GEORGE F. AND ETHEL W. GIERING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1979 by George F. Giering, Class of 1965, in memory and in honor of his parents, George F. and Ethel W. Giering. Preference is given to students who live in Connecticut.

GEORGE F. GIERING '65 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2014 by George F. Giering, Class of 1965, to be awarded to students who are active members of the Corps of Cadets.

LT JOHN M. GODFREY '66 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1968 by contributions and gifts from his parents, alumni, and friends in memory of John Godfrey, Jr., Class of 1966.

GOKEY/DUNHAM FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2010, this scholarship is awarded annually to students who without scholarship support might not be able to obtain a college education. This scholarship is open to all Norwich undergraduates who are residents of Vermont and demonstrate a strong financial need. Preference for this scholarship is given to students who are first-generation college attendees. This scholarship is renewable through the senior year.

HAZEL N. GOYETTE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1989 by the estate of Hazel N. Goyette. The income is used for the purpose of providing financial aid to students at Norwich University.

ROSAMOND F. GRANGER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1985 for the aid of students in memory of Rosamond F. Granger.

CAPTAIN THOMAS O. GREENOUGH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1997 by the will of Captain Thomas O. Greenough, former faculty member, for the purpose of providing scholarships for students who have demonstrated outstanding leadership and scholastic ability.

GRIDIRON SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1971 by the Gridiron Foundation of Washington, D.C., in memory of John O'Laughlin, trustee from 1933-1942, for students pursuing courses in political science and journalism with a preference for minority students.

NANCY TUTHERLY GRIFFIN VC'67 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1976 by Nancy's family and friends. Before her accidental death in 1975, Nancy dedicated her life to the improvement of women's rights. In recognition of her life's work, this

scholarship is offered with a preference for women students. Additionally, a portion of the fund may be used for the purchase of books on the topics of women's issues.

GURUN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established to be first awarded to students who are active members of the Corps of Cadets and demonstrate good character, scholastic promise, leadership potential, and financial need.

HARRY T. HALE '55 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2003 by the family of Harry T. Hale, Class of 1955. It is awarded annually to a student majoring in engineering and is open to students of all class years. The selected student should be involved in campus activities and should demonstrate financial need.

HALLAM-BARNETT SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1969 by Mr. and Mrs. Robert Hallam, Class of 1944, and former trustee, in memory of their parents, George and Gladys Hallam, and Frank and Louise Barnett. Awarded to students on the basis of all-around quality with preference to lineal descendants of the Hallams and Barnetts.

HANEY FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by Mark and Bobbi '79 Haney, this ten-year term endowed scholarship is awarded to a student(s) who is a senior with a GPA of 3.0 or higher and majoring in civil engineering. If no senior is eligible, the scholarship may be awarded to a junior who meets the above-stated criteria. The student(s) must demonstrate financial need.

KIERAN M. HANNON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by Jeffrey K., Class of 1986 and Deirdre E. Hannon in loving memory of their son Kieran, the scholarship is to be awarded to student(s) who are members of the Corps of Cadets with demonstrated financial need. Preference is given to those who plan to serve in the military following graduation, with the Marine Corps taking precedence. Preference also given to students in the Boston, MA area, then expanded to the state of Massachusetts. The scholarship is renewable should the student(s) continue to meet the criteria.

DON HANNUM '51 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by the estate of Don Hannum, Class of 1951, and supplemented by gifts from Don's family and friends. Scholarships are awarded to students majoring in mechanical engineering who maintain a GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate financial need.

LULA RYAN HANSEN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1992 by Mr. and Mrs. Herman Eichorn in honor of Mrs. Eichorn's mother. The scholarship is used for women with preference given to women from Vermont.

MG ERNEST N. HARMON SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1979 in memory of MG Ernest N. Harmon. General Harmon served as president of Norwich University from 1950 until his retirement in 1965. As a Norwich cadet, as Commandant, and as President, General Harmon's leadership inspired thousands of Norwich students. The scholarship is for the benefit of deserving students in the Corps of Cadets.

LORING HART SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Dr. Jon H. Larson, Class of 1963, the scholarship shall be made available to all matriculated undergraduate students who have demonstrated need. The recipient may be a freshman or an upperclassman.

WILLIAM RANDOLPH HEARST ENDOWMENT FOR MINORITY STUDENTS

Established in 1991 by the Hearst Foundation in memory of William Randolph Hearst. It provides funds for two scholarships for disadvantaged youth, including Native Americans and other minority students, with preference given to students from Vermont.

WALTER '45 AND EDITH HENRY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 through the estate of Walter '45 and Edith Henry, the scholarship is awarded annually to students enrolled in an engineering program with preference given to students whose hometown is within Vermont.

GRAHAM A. HIGGINS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1997 in memory of their son, Graham A. Higgins, Class of 1990, by Peter and Priscilla Higgins. The scholarship is awarded to a member of the Corps of Cadets in their junior or senior year with preference given to candidates who are pursuing a career in naval aviation.

WILLIAM HIGGINS, III SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1975 by his family in memory of Cadet Captain William A. Higgins, III, Class of 1974, whose degree in civil engineering was awarded posthumously. The scholarship recipient must be a sophomore, junior or senior member of the Corps of Cadets pursuing a degree in one of the engineering disciplines. The recipients shall exhibit a high degree of devotion to the Corps, to the University, and to the United States of America and not be the recipient of a ROTC scholarship. The recipient shall be, overall, an outstanding cadet.

CHARLES A. '67 AND KATHLEEN M. HOLDEN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 by Charles A. Holden, Jr. Class of 1967. Preference is given first to a student(s) from eastern Massachusetts. If a student from eastern Massachusetts is not available, preference will be given to student(s) from Canada, and then to a student(s) from New England. Scholarships are awarded to one or more incoming students who have demonstrated an interest in being active in campus activities. This scholarship may be renewed through the student's senior year if the student has had a positive impact on the college community through involvement in meaningful campus and/or community activities.

DAVID B. "DIXIE" AND RUTH C. HOLLIS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1977 by David B. Hollis, Jr., Class of 1922. Its purpose, in Mr. Hollis' words, is "to help some worthy students get an education and in doing so bring credit to Norwich."

NORMAN C. HOOPER CLASS OF 1912 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by the will of Evelyn Stenstream, a longtime friend of Norwich University. This scholarship is awarded to good, deserving students.

RICHARD HOSMER '34 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by Caroline Hosmer in memory of her husband Richard Hosmer, Class of 1934, with the assistance of family members and friends. Preference is given to members of the Corps of Cadets majoring in Engineering.

JOHN '32 AND EMMA HURLEY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1995 by the estate of John and Emma Hurley, Class of 1932, to provide unrestricted scholarship aid to students enrolled at Norwich University.

STEPHANIE M. HURLEY '07 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2009 by friends and family of Stephanie Marie Hurley, Class of 2007, this scholarship is awarded annually to a female member of the Corps of Cadets who displays the characteristics of leadership, honor, and integrity. This scholarship is to be awarded to a student majoring in criminal justice and who maintains a GPA of 3.0. This scholarship may be renewed through the student's senior year should they maintain the above requirements for the scholarship.

DONALD JENNINGS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established for students who are active on the Mountain Cold Weather Rescue Team. Recipients of this scholarship must also be an active member of the Army ROTC program. Preference for this scholarship is given first to a senior, second preference is to a junior. The recipient must demonstrate financial need. If awarded to a junior, this scholarship may be renewed through the student's senior year.

JEPHSON EDUCATIONAL TRUST

Established in 2000, the scholarship is awarded on an annual basis to a deserving student who might not otherwise be able to afford the cost of an education.

LT PHILIP M. JOHANSON SCHOLARSHIP

Established in March of 1992 by the estate of Lois Johanson in memory of her son Lieutenant Philip M. Johanson, Class of 1965. The income is to be used for the benefit of New Hampshire students entering Norwich University in their freshman year.

FRANK A. JUCKETT SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1957 in memory of Frank A. Juckett, who at the time of his death in May of that year, had been a trustee of Norwich University for 27 years. The fund was established by his son, J. Walter Juckett, Class of 1930, and is awarded annually to students pursuing a degree in engineering. First priority is given to an offspring of an employee of the Sandy Hill Corporation. Second priority is to a son or daughter of an affiliated company, Kamy, Inc. Third priority goes to children from Hudson Falls, New York, and fourth priority to students from the Albany and Glens Falls districts. If there are no candidates in these categories, the scholarship is awarded on the basis of good character, scholastic promise, leadership potential, and financial need.

J. WALTER JUCKETT '30 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1990 in memory of J. Walter Juckett, Class of 1930. The Board of Trustees established the fund from the estate of Mr. Juckett because of his interest in helping needy

students. Priority is given to academically talented students with financial need pursuing majors in engineering, science, and mathematics.

BG PAUL F. KAVANAUGH, USA (RET.) '57 AND MARJORIE M. KAVANAUGH SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021, by BG Paul F. Kavanaugh, USA (Ret.) '57 and Marjorie M. Kavanaugh, the scholarship is to be awarded to student(s) that demonstrate financial need and majoring in engineering. Second preference is for student(s) majoring in science or technology.

JOSEPH KEATING '56 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1988 in memory of Joseph A. Keating, Class of 1956, by his wife Elaine together with gifts from family, friends, and alumni of Norwich University. The scholarship is awarded annually with first preference being given to a student from Peterborough, New Hampshire, enrolling in the Corps of Cadets.

RICHARD L. '45 AND BARBARA C. KEENAN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 by Richard, Class of 1945, in memory of his wife Barbara, a graduate of Tufts University, Class of 1942. This scholarship is awarded to a member of the Corps of Cadets entering either their junior or senior year who is pursuing a major in chemistry, biology, or mathematics. Preference is given to those from Waltham, Massachusetts. Should a cadet from Waltham not be available, a cadet from Massachusetts may be awarded. This scholarship may be renewed through the cadet's senior year.

SGT ADAM P. KENNEDY '04 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016 by J. David Kennedy and Nancy A. Smyth in memory of their son, Sergeant Adam P. Kennedy, Class of 2004, this scholarship is to be awarded first to students who are active members of the Mountain Cold Weather Company. When possible, this scholarship should be awarded to students who are graduates of Xaverian Brothers High School. If no students matching the first or second preference are available, this scholarship may also be awarded to active members of the Corps of Cadets from Massachusetts.

JOHN W. KENNEDY, JR. '63 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by Jo-Anne C. Kennedy, and the John W. Kennedy Company, Incorporated in memory of John W. Kennedy, Jr., Class of 1963, this scholarship assists deserving students who have demonstrated financial need and who otherwise might not be able to obtain the advantage of a college education.

JOHN W. KENNEDY, III '96 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2015 by the friends and family of John W. Kennedy, III, Class of 1996, this scholarship is awarded annually to students who are members of the Corps of Cadets and represent the values and traditions of Norwich University. Preference is given to students whose hometown is within New England (Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont, Rhode Island, and Connecticut).

RUSSELL OLIVER KING '36 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2009 by William W. Steele, Class of 1959, in memory of Russell Oliver King, Norwich University Class of 1936. Mr. King was a Professional Engineer, WWII and Korean

Conflict Veteran, Chief Engineer of Green Mountain Power Company and Senior Vice President of Edison Sault Electric. This scholarship is awarded to a member of the Corps of Cadets who has demonstrated good character and financial need. Preference will be given to those who might not otherwise obtain a college education and to those in an engineering curriculum.

RICHARD '67 AND LINDA KISLOSKI CIVIL ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by Richard, Class of 1967 and Linda Kisloski, the scholarship is to be awarded to United States Citizen members of the Corps of Cadets with demonstrated financial need, a GPA of 3.0 or higher and who are majoring in civil engineering. Preference is given to residents of Massachusetts, and then from any New England state. The scholarship is renewable should the student(s) continue to meet the above-stated criteria.

PETER D. KNOWLTON SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1966 by Richard Knowlton, Class of 1932, in memory of his son Peter D. Knowlton, Class of 1964. Preference for the scholarship is given to Vermont residents.

KREITZBERG FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by Fred and Barbara Kreitzberg. Preference for this scholarship is given first to students from Marin County, California and then to students from California.

A. RALPH KRISTELLER, M.D. '50 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002, the A. Ralph Kristeller, M.D. scholarship is awarded to any worthy student with demonstrated financial need who is a member of the Corps of Cadets. First preference is given to students pursuing science majors.

FRANCIS R. '45 AND ELAINE LAFAYETTE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by Francis R., Class of 1945, and Elaine Lafayette. Preference is given to a Vermont student in the Corps of Cadets pursuing engineering course work. The student must have demonstrated financial need.

JOHN AUGUST LANGENFELD '64 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 by John's friends and classmates to recognize his accomplishments while a student at Norwich, particularly his degree in Electrical Engineering. This scholarship is offered to members of the Corps of Cadets pursuing Electrical Engineering majors.

MAUREEN C. LARSEN '90 SCHOLARSHIP

Established to be first awarded to students who are majoring in nursing. This donor prefers that this scholarship is awarded to students from Vermont. If there are not students matching the criteria listed above, this scholarship may then be awarded to students whose major is biology with a preference given to students from Vermont.

JON '63 & JUDITH LARSON SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2019 by Jon Larson '63, this scholarship is to be awarded to student(s) transferring to Norwich University from an accredited public community or state college. Second preference is to any student(s) from New Jersey or New Hampshire. The student(s) selected must demonstrate financial need.

GREGG LEA SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1977 by Mr. and Mrs. William H. Lea, Jr., Class of 1950, in memory of their son, Cadet Major Gregg W. Lea who died on March 15, 1977. His baccalaureate degree was awarded posthumously. The initial contribution by the Leas has been increased by the gifts of classmates, by his friends, and by other family members. Preference is given to incoming members of the freshmen class, with outstanding moral character and a demonstrated concern for others, a 2.5 GPA, as well as demonstrated financial need. The renewal of the scholarship will depend on the student(s) maintaining the above-stated criteria.

METROPOLITAN NYC ALUMNI CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by the Metropolitan New York City Alumni Club in memory of Walter Neville Levy, Class of 1963. 2nd Lt. Levy, a New York City resident, was the first Norwich graduate to be killed in action in Vietnam. The scholarship is awarded to a senior or junior in the Corps of Cadets who has demonstrated financial need and good academic standing. The recipient must be from the metropolitan New York City geographic area.

LINDSAY SCHOLARSHIP

Established to annually assist students in the pursuit of higher education.

HENRY LISOWSKI '44 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established to be awarded to students who rank in the top 20% of their class with demonstrated financial need and who show leadership and determination.

MR. AND MRS. ALAN T. LOCKARD '44 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by Charles A. Lockard in memory of his father Alan T. Lockard, Class of 1944. This scholarship is awarded to members of the Corps of Cadets entering their junior year and majoring in computer engineering, computer science, computer information systems, or electrical engineering. Students must maintain a GPA of 2.75 or better and have demonstrated financial need.

LT. JAMES A. LOGAN POST 6800 VFW SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Lieutenant James A. Logan Post 6800 VFW and awarded annually to an incoming senior who plans to commission upon graduation. This student may be an active member of the Corps of Cadets or actively participating in one of the ROTC programs at Norwich. The student must be a citizen of the United States. Preference of this scholarship is first given to students from Somerville, Massachusetts, then to students from any of the following towns in Massachusetts: Medford, Arlington, Cambridge, Charlestown, or Watertown. If there is no student available from these towns, the scholarship may then be awarded to a student from Massachusetts.

LOTZ FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1985, the Lotz Family Scholarship is provided to a student who is seeking a bachelor's degree in business. The student may be a freshman or upperclassman. Recipients will possess a cumulative grade point average of at least a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. The student must have demonstrated financial need.

DAVID '54 AND NINA LUCE FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship was established in 2004 by David W. Luce, Class of 1954, and Nina E. Luce, in memory of Alexander Walker Luce, head of the Mechanical Engineering Department, 1957 through 1964, and Gladness Wharton Luce. The scholarship is awarded to juniors or seniors majoring in either mechanical, civil, or electrical engineering with a preference for members of the Corps of Cadets. Recipients must demonstrate the creative thought process necessary to become outstanding innovative design engineers as determined by the division of engineering. Scholarships are available for up to two students per year and may be renewed provided the student continues to meet the scholarship criteria.

DAVID '54 AND NINA LUCE NURSING SCHOLARSHIP

Established by David, Class of 1954 and Nina Luce in celebration of his 60th reunion. This scholarship is awarded annually to students who are members of the Corps of Cadets, majoring in nursing, and maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5. It is preferred that the student is from California.

LUZZI BROTHERS ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2020 by Lawrence J. Budnick, Jr. '64, this scholarship is to be awarded to a student(s) in the Corps of Cadets who demonstrates high financial need and is majoring in engineering.

HAZEL M. LYONS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2015 by George W. Lyons, Class of 1965, in memory of his mother, Hazel M. Lyons. The donor prefers this scholarship be awarded to a student(s) from Pennsylvania and a member of the Corps of Cadets. The student(s) who receive this scholarship must demonstrate financial need.

BRENDAN MACDONALD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by Robert and Lou Ellen MacDonald in memory of their son, Brendan. This scholarship is awarded to members of the Corps of Cadets in their sophomore, junior, or senior year with students from Massachusetts receiving preference. To be eligible, students must be in good academic standing and demonstrate financial need.

ROBERT W. MACDUFF '60 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2020 by Robert W. '60 and Sue MacDuff, the scholarship is to be awarded to a member(s) of the Corps of Cadets who are majoring in business, engineering, or nursing. The student(s) must demonstrate financial need.

MACK SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1993 by Robert Mack, Class of 1964, to be awarded to a student of need within or entering the Corps of Cadets with a major in english or business.

HUGH N. MARCH '50 AND ROLAND C. MARCH, JR. '42 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1997 in memory of Roland C. March, Jr., Class of 1942, by his brother Hugh N. March, Class of 1951. Roland served on the Norwich Board of Fellows and Alumni Association. Awards are made annually to enrolled students in the Corps of Cadets with preference being given to students from Cape Cod, Massachusetts.

TED MARSDEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2010 through the estate of Edwin “Ted” L. Marsden, and through the generosity of friends and family who Ted impacted. This scholarship was established to honor the memory of Ted, a former faculty member in the School of Mathematics and Sciences, mentor and longtime friend of Norwich University. The scholarship is awarded annually to one or more students majoring in mathematics. Preference for this scholarship is given to those students who demonstrate characteristics often shown by Ted: compassion for others, willing to give a helping hand, the potential to succeed, and a passion for mathematics. Should the student(s) continue to meet all requirements, this scholarship may be renewed through their senior year.

HAROLD “DOC” MARTIN, CLASS OF 1920 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by Benjamin Lowell Price, III '93, Cedric D. George '87, Willie V. Wright '93, Anthony L. Johnson '94 and Tonya Y. Thorne '94 in memory of Doc Martin, Norwich University's first African American graduate. The scholarship is to be awarded to minority student(s) that demonstrate high financial need, with preference given to African American students.

WALTER G. AND KATHERINE M. MCCRACKEN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1990 in memory of Walter G. and Katherine M. McCracken by their son, Douglas M. McCracken, Class of 1970. The scholarship is restricted to a student in the Corps of Cadets.

COL DAVID H. MCINTYRE, USA SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by Victor Linck M'13 to honor COL David H. McIntyre, USA, the scholarship is to be awarded to members of the Corps of Cadets or students who are veterans. The student must demonstrate financial need and the scholarship is renewable should the student(s) continue to meet the criteria.

METCALF AND EDDY – BOSTON POST, SAME SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1989, this scholarship provides an annual scholarship for a student enrolled in civil or environmental engineering, science or construction management disciplines. Preference is given to students likely to be commissioned through the ROTC program.

MILANO FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1982 with preference given to graduates of St. John's Preparatory School in Danvers, Massachusetts, and then to high school students from Massachusetts. The student should show a demonstrated financial need.

MILITARY COLLEGE OF VERMONT LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2020 by CDR Richard L. Berkman PE, USN '69 in memory of his classmates, LT Richard Gray '69, USA, Arty (KIA Vietnam) and LT Paul Halkovich '69, USA, OrdC, who died in the line of duty and all other Norwich University graduates who gave their lives in service of the United States of America. The scholarship is to be awarded to students who are descendants of Norwich University alumni. Preference is given to those students who are descendants of Norwich Alumni who gave their life in service of the United States or who have served in one of the uniformed services of the United States, to include the United States Public Health Service Commissioned Corps and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Commissioned Corps. The student(s) selected must demonstrate financial need.

MADISON RENNE MISNER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2011 by Chet and Shannon Misner, Class of 1990, in memory of their daughter. Scholarships are awarded to students who participate in the Norwich University Christian Fellowship Club. This scholarship is awardable through the student's senior year.

PETER L. MOLINARI '32 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1986 in memory of Peter L. Molinari, Class of 1932, to be awarded to students with demonstrated financial need.

ALBERT C. MOLTER '28 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1991 in memory of Albert C. Molter, Sr., Class of 1928, by his wife, Emma, family, and friends. Because of their interest and concern for young people and education, the Molters earmarked a memorial gift for a scholarship.

MOONEY FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by Bill, Class of 1986 and Terry Mooney, the scholarship is to be awarded to members of the Corps of Cadets who maintain a 2.75 GPS and demonstrate financial need. Preference is given to student(s) who are prior or currently enlisted servicemember(s) in the U.S. Armed Forces, National Guard or Reserves. The scholarship is renewable should the student(s) continue to meet the above-stated criteria for a maximum of eight semesters.

KENNETH '69 AND BONNIE MOREL FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2022 by Ken '69 and Bonnie Morel, the scholarship is to be awarded to lineal descendants of Ken '69 and Bonnie Morel. Should no lineal descendants be available, the scholarship will be awarded to members of the Corps of Cadets majoring in engineering with a preference for Civil Engineering. Recipient(s) must demonstrate financial need and may be renewed should the criteria continue to be met.

KATE MOSKAL '95 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 in Kate's memory by Al Moskal, Class of 1967, and Robert Moskal. Scholarships are awarded to female members of the Corps of Cadets who demonstrate financial need.

CHRIS MUNN '81 RUGBY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016, in honor of Chris Munn, Class of 1981, the scholarship is presented to a returning member of either the University's men's or women's rugby teams who demonstrates leadership, courage, and dedication, both on and off the pitch. The student-athlete must exemplify these attributes, be in good academic standing and demonstrate financial need. Should rugby become a NCAA recognized sport, the scholarship will be awarded to a student who exemplifies the traits listed above.

BARRY AND CONNIE MYNTER FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by the family and friends of Barry and Connie Mynter, long time professor, coach and volunteer at Norwich University, the scholarship is to be awarded to student(s) in good academic standing that demonstrate financial need and are Vermont residents.

THOMAS JOHN NAZZARO SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by John Nazzaro, PhD, in memory of his son, Thomas (1982-1999). This scholarship is to be awarded annually to lineal descendants of the 9th and 10th U.S. Cavalry Regiments, known as “the Buffalo Soldiers”, with preference given to lineal descendants of the United States Military Academy Cavalry Detachment at West Point, New York. If no student(s) meet the original criteria, the scholarship will be awarded to an African American student(s) who is a member of the Corps of Cadets and active in the Army ROTC program.

DENTON '55 AND LYNN NICHOLS ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018 through the trust of Denton, Class of 1955 and Lynn Nichols, this scholarship is awarded to students majoring in Civil Engineering who have demonstrated financial need.

NORTH SHORE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1983 by Mike Frangos, Class of 1952, and James Abare, Class of 1957, to assist a student or students from the North Shore area of Massachusetts. Preference is given to students from Essex County with consideration given to students from adjacent cities and towns. Preference is given to members of the Corps of Cadets with consideration given to members of the civilian student body. Students are required to carry a 2.5 GPA and must demonstrate financial need. The scholarship is open to all classes including first-year students.

NORTHFIELD SAVINGS BANK FOUNDER’S AWARD

Established in 1993 in honor of the Reverend Edward J. Bourns, PhD, fifth president of Norwich University from 1850-1865, and founder of the Northfield Savings Bank in 1867. The scholarship is awarded to a student with demonstrated financial need within the service communities of the bank.

NORTHFIELD SAVINGS BANK SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1994 by the Northfield Savings Bank and the Norwich alumni and Vermont business leaders. The Northfield Savings Bank Scholarship is awarded to one student who resides in the service area of the Northfield Savings Bank (from Central Vermont or Chittenden County), and this award is formally presented at the annual NU/NSB Golf Tournament or similar event.

NORWICH UNIVERSITY BOSTON GOLF SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Norwich University Boston Golf Committee, this scholarship is awarded to incoming sophomores, juniors, or seniors from the greater Boston area. The scholarship grows each year through proceeds from the Boston Golf Tournament. The scholarship is presented to individuals who exhibit a commitment to the Norwich community and academic excellence.

NU CORPS WOMEN'S SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by LTC Annette L. Redmond, USA (Ret.) and Tina E. Stevens both Norwich University Class of 1983, the scholarship is to be awarded to a female member of the Corps of Cadets. The student must demonstrate financial need and the scholarship is renewable should the student(s) continue to meet the criteria.

THOMAS HENRY OGIBA '97 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1997 by James and Paula Ogiba in memory of their son, Cadet Thomas Henry Ogiba, Class of 1997, who died on August 11, 1996. Family, friends, and classmates joined with the family to make this scholarship possible. Preference for scholarship awards is an incoming member of the Corps of Cadets with strong academic standing and demonstrated financial need.

FRANK E. PACKARD '21 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1974 by the will of Frank E. Packard, Class of 1921, as a general scholarship.

STEVEN M. PAEN '79 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in honor of Steven M. Paen '79, by his brother, Anthony Paen and nephew, Alex Maricich, the scholarship is awarded to student(s) with demonstrated high financial need.

CAPTAIN ANTHONY PALERMO, JR. '02 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in memory of Anthony Palermo, Jr., Class of 2002, to be awarded to students who are members of the Corps of Cadets, active in an ROTC program and have maintained a grade point average of 2.3 or better.

PARKIN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1998 in honor of Robert A. Parkin, Class of 1959, and Leslie Parkin-Corwin, Vermont College Class of 1962. The income is used to fund an annual scholarship for a student with demonstrated financial need.

JEET PATEL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by family and friends in memory of Jeet Patel, a 1st Sergeant of Band Company at Norwich University studying Criminal Justice and Cybersecurity. The scholarship is to be awarded to a member(s) of the Norwich University Regimental Band in good academic standing and with demonstrated financial need. The scholarship is renewable should the student(s) continue to meet the criteria.

MAJ GEN JOHN PATTON WAR & PEACE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2006 by Major General John S. Patton, USAF (Ret.) and Professor Mary Frances M. Patton, this scholarship is awarded to a student majoring in Studies in War and Peace. The recipient must demonstrate academic success and financial need.

DAVID M. PAUL '52 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2012 by the David M. Paul Family Foundation, to honor the memory of David M. Paul, Class of 1952. The scholarship is awarded to one or more student majoring in Engineering.

PETROCELLI FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2003 by John Petrocelli, Sr., and his sons John, Class of 1974, Jim, Class of 1976, Joe, Class of 1981, and Jerome, Class of 1984, the Petrocelli Family Scholarship is awarded to a member of the Corps of Cadets in his/her junior year. The recipient must be an active member of the Air Force ROTC program at Norwich, have an overall GPA of at least 2.75 and demonstrated financial need. Preference will be given to students from the metropolitan New York or Long Island areas. If no student from these areas meets the above-stated criteria, this scholarship will be made available to students from any geographic area who otherwise qualify.

HENRY MOSES PHILLIPS, CLASS OF 1864 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1950 by the will of Henry Alexander Phillips of Hoboken, New Jersey, in memory of his father, Henry Moses Phillips, Class of 1864.

STEPHEN R. PORCELLA '57 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 in memory of Stephen R. Porcella, Class of 1957, by Donald R. Morton, MD, Class of 1957, with the assistance of many classmates. Major Porcella was killed in a helicopter crash in 1968 during hostile action in the Republic of Vietnam. Preference is given to students who are lineal descendants of the Class of 1957, then to students whose parent(s) died while serving in a branch of the armed forces or another government agency (federal, state or local), then to students with demonstrated financial need.

E. MILES & ANN K. PRENTICE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2012, the scholarship is first be awarded to a student who is from Vermont and is majoring in Nursing. This scholarship may then be awarded to either a student from Vermont or a student who is majoring in nursing. Students who receive this scholarship are encouraged to demonstrate their interest in helping others by repaying this fund for the benefit received.

LT. RICHARD P. RAND '65 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2015 by George W. Lyons '65 in memory of Lt. Richard P. Rand '65. The donor prefers this scholarship be awarded to a student(s) from the state of Massachusetts and a member of the Corps of Cadets. The student(s) who receive this scholarship must demonstrate financial need.

OSCAR W. RAY '12 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1958 by the will of Oscar E. Ray of New York City, Class of 1912. Funds are used for students of high academic ability, good character, need, and loyalty.

COL EDWIN T. & MARCELLA D. RHATIGAN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by Steven C. Rhatigan, Class of 1972, in honor of his parents Col Edwin T. and Marcella D. Rhatigan. Preference is given to students majoring in Engineering, Math or Science with demonstrated financial need. Where possible, the scholarship is awarded to students who have family members who have served or are currently serving in the military.

PAUL RICKER '79 AND MICHAEL CRIMMINS '80 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021, by alumni and friends in memory of Paul Ricker '79 and Michael Crimmins '80, the scholarship is to be awarded to a deserving student(s) from New England who has demonstrated leadership, dedication, and passion for extracurricular activities. The student(s) must demonstrate financial need.

RENEE A. ROBBINS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2012 by the friends and family of Renee A. Robins, member of the Class of 2015, the scholarship is awarded annually to students who are active members of the Corps of Cadets. Preference is given to students who are majoring in Criminal Justice and/or Computer Security and Information Assurance.

R. AVERY ROBINSON '29 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1985 by Anna Broadhurst in memory of her brother R. Avery Robinson, Class of 1929.

JOSEPH RYSZ '67 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2005 by Joe's family, friends and classmates, the scholarship honors Joe and the friendships and life-lessons he gained as both a student and an alum. Preference for this scholarship is given to members of the Corps of Cadets who demonstrate a commitment to community involvement and on-campus activities.

JOSEPH G. AND RUTH R. SABOL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999, the Joseph G. and Ruth R. Sabol Memorial Scholarship honors the memory of Coach Joe Sabol, coach, athletic director, mentor and friend. The scholarship is awarded to students who participate in campus activities. Preference is given to seniors or to graduates of Northfield High School.

G. MAX SANBORN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1983 by the will of G. Max Sanborn. Recipients are nominated by the Northfield, Vermont Rotary Club with graduates of Northfield High School receiving preference. Membership in the Norwich University Corps of Cadets is also a preference, but not a requirement, of this scholarship.

PROFESSORS FRANK SARGENT AND EBER A. SPENCER, JR. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in May 2006 by Paul Vincent Kenned, Class of 1971, and Rebecca Parfitt Kennedy in memory of Professors Frank Sargent, and Eber A. Spencer, Jr., this scholarship shall be awarded annually to a senior in the Corps of Cadets who has demonstrated both 1) high academic achievement, 3.0 cumulative GPA or greater and 2) financial need. It is the donor's intention that preference is given, but not limited, to students in the departments of business management, accounting, and history.

ERIC W. SCHMIDT '55 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2002 by Eric W. Schmidt to honor the memory of Lt. Martin J. Gavio, Class of 1949, who was killed in action in Korea in 1952. Lt. Gavio's encouragement and financial support enabled Mr. Schmidt to attend Norwich University. This award is made to an incoming freshman who is a member of the Corps of Cadets, a United States citizen and has demonstrated academic merit and high moral character. First consideration is given to graduates of Point Pleasant Beach High School in Point Pleasant Beach, New Jersey.

RADM RICHARD W. SCHNEIDER COAST GUARD SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship is to be awarded to one or more sophomore, junior or senior class members who are demonstrably striving for a United States Coast Guard career. The student(s) must evidence prior and continuing diligence toward pursuing a Coast Guard career (such as joining the Coast Guard Reserve or interning at a Coast Guard facility, among others), be in good academic standing and demonstrate financial need. The scholarship is renewable should the student(s) continue to meet the above-stated criteria.

RICHARD & JAIME SCHNEIDER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2020, in recognition of Richard and Jaime Schneider for their long and distinguished service to Norwich, the scholarship is to be awarded to student(s) that demonstrate financial need.

OLIN SCOTT SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1920 in Bennington, Vermont by the will of Olin Scott. Funds are restricted to young men who are Vermont residents.

MICHAEL J. SERBA '05 MEMORIAL FUND

Established in 2006 this scholarship is awarded annually to an international student who has demonstrated a commitment to leadership through participation in extracurricular activities. The scholarship is renewable for up to four years if the student maintains 3.0 GPA.

SERGEANTS THREE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by Paul Vincent, Class of 1971 and Rebeca C. P. Kennedy to honor three Mountain and Cold Weather Army Sergeants: MSG Leslie Hurley, USA (Ret.), SFC Donald Jennings, USA (Ret.) and MSG Gordon "Duke" Dewey, USA (Ret.). This scholarship is to be awarded to special operation soldiers, sailors, marines and airmen who are enrolled in the Strategic Studies and Defense Analysis degree completion program through the College of Graduate and Continuing Studies (CGCS) to prevent gaps in education progress caused by tuition reimbursement caps or delays. Preference given to senior enlisted leaders without excluding junior enlisted or commissioned students. Students selected for the scholarship should be in high academic standing.

ABRAHAM SHAPIRO SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Jacob Shapiro, Class of 1936, and his wife, Alese, in memory of their son, Abraham, who died at the age of 25. Abraham Shapiro loved Vermont and made it his home. He also loved working with his hands. The scholarship is awarded to Norwich students or those pursuing a technical course of studies. The overriding selection factor is a financial need and, where possible, preference is given to students from rural areas of Vermont. (Income is shared with Vermont Technical College.)

SHARBAUGH-MEYERS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2019 by Gene W. '84 and Emilie (Meyers) Sharbaugh in Honor and in Loving Memory of their parents, The Reverend (SSG) and Mrs. (Thelma) Melvin G. Sharbaugh, USA (Ret.), LTC Jay M. Meyers, USA (Ret.) and Dr. Muriel A. (Meyers) Vollum, Ed.D. The scholarship is awarded to cadets entering their junior year participating in a commissioning program in one of the branches of the armed forces. The scholarship will not be awarded to students who already have an ROTC scholarship. The student(s) who receive this scholarship must demonstrate academic success and financial need. This scholarship is renewable for the student(s) senior year if all criteria continues to be met.

JOHN SHAW MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Lawrence P. Costa, Class of 1980 in honor of John Shaw. This scholarship is to be awarded to a student(s) who are members of both the Corps of Cadets and the Mountain Cold

Weather Company. The student(s) selected must be upperclassmen maintaining a GPA of 2.5 or better and have demonstrated financial need.

CLIFTON A. SHINQUIN '18 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by the estate of Clifton A. Shinquin, Class of 1918; preference is given to members of the Corps of Cadets from New England with an interest in science.

BENJAMIN SIMEONE, JR. '52 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1984 by Salvatore B. Simeone and Benjamin A. Simeone, Jr., in honor of their father, this scholarship was renamed in memory of Benjamin A. Simeone, Jr., Class of 1952. This scholarship is awarded annually to students who demonstrate financial need.

SKILLINGS FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Skillings Family and awarded annually to students who are members of the Corps of Cadets. Students who receive this scholarship must demonstrate financial need. This scholarship is awardable throughout the student's senior year if the student continues to meet the requirements of the scholarship.

ROBERT J. SKINNER '63 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2004 by the friends, family, and classmates of Bob Skinner, Class of 1963. The scholarship is awarded to students from the Central Massachusetts area and then to students from Massachusetts.

SKULL AND SWORDS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2007 by its past members, in honor of the proud traditions of Norwich University's senior secret honor society, Skull and Swords. This scholarship is awarded to a rising senior who is a member of and dedicated to upholding the traditions of the Corps of Cadets. This student should demonstrate qualities of character, leadership, and academic achievement. Preference for this scholarship is given to lineal descendants of the Skull and Swords.

ROBERT W. SMALL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2007 in honor of Robert W. Small, this scholarship is awarded to an upperclassman student who has demonstrated the potential for success. Preference for this scholarship is given to students majoring in electrical engineering or chemistry. The student must demonstrate financial need.

LESSLIE W. '26 AND RUTH POMEROY SMITH SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1994 by the estate of Lesslie W., Class of 1926, and Ruth Pomeroy Smith. Preference is given to incoming members of the Corps of Cadets, enrolled in ROTC programs, with strong academic standing and demonstrated financial need.

VINCENT AND SUSANNE SMITH SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2017 by Robert C. Smith, the scholarship is awarded to students who are from the state of Massachusetts, in the Corps of Cadets, and upon graduating plan to commission in one of the branches of the armed forces. The student should embody the values of Norwich: Honor, Integrity, Perseverance and Service to others. The student selected for the scholarship does not

have to be an academic leader at the time of the award but should demonstrate motivation and academic promise.

R. MICHAEL SMULLEN '76 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2021 by R. Michael, Class of 1976 and Traci J. Smullen, the scholarship is to be awarded to members of the Corps of Cadets from the state of Vermont who maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 and have demonstrated financial need. The scholarship is renewable if the criteria continues to be met.

PHILIP DANFORTH SNYDER '07 ARCHITECTURE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2006 by Anne and Kendrick Snyder in memory of their son Philip Danforth Snyder, Class of 2007, this scholarship is first awarded to a student(s) pursuing a major in architecture. Second preference of this scholarship will be given to students who graduated from St. Andrew's High School in Barrington, Rhode Island. Students must maintain a 2.5 GPA and demonstrate financial need.

SOUDERS FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2020 by Ronald L. Souders, Class of 1969, and wife Faith, in honor of their children Whitney and Benjamin, the scholarship is to be awarded to an incoming freshman who holds US Citizenship and is from Fulton or Chester County, Pennsylvania; Washington County, Maryland; or graduate of the Massanutten Military Academy, Woodstock, VA. The selected student must possess exceptional academic merit by achieving a high school GPA of 3.75 and shows demonstrate financial need. Preference is given to students who choose to join the Corps of Cadets, and to those students pursuing a major in architecture or business. This scholarship is renewable for eight full-time semesters while student(s) continue to meet scholarship criteria.

PAUL GERARD SOUZA '84 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1983 by Mr. and Mrs. Edmund J. Souza in memory of their son, Paul G. Souza, Class of 1984, who died during his sophomore year. Funds are used for scholarships for members of the Corps of Cadets.

LLOYD STARBUCK '34 MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2000 in memory of Lloyd J. Starbuck, Class of 1934. The scholarship is awarded to a member of the junior class to be used during his or her senior year. Preference is given to students from western Massachusetts and to engineering majors.

STARR FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1989 to honor Sepp Ruschp, the first ski instructor at the University in the 1930s, and later president of the Mount Mansfield Company in Stowe.

JOSEPH STEDMAN, CLASS of 1859 SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established in 1953 by Annie C. Stedman in memory of her father, Joseph Stedman, Class of 1859. This scholarship is used to aid deserving students from Massachusetts attending Norwich University.

STEELE FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by Ed, Class of 1959, and Karen Steele. Students qualify for this scholarship if they meet one of the following two standards. The first standard is for an entering freshman who is a graduate of the Stoneleigh-Burnham School in Greenfield, Massachusetts who is

pursuing a degree in nursing. The second standard is for an entering freshman from the Central Vermont area (with a preference for students from Waterbury, VT) who will be a member of the Corps of Cadets. Scholarships may be renewed provided the student maintains a minimum GPA of 2.5.

DR. EDWIN HARRINGTON STEELE SCHOLARSHIP

Established to be given annually to a member of the Corps of Cadets who has demonstrated good character and financial need. Preference will be given to those who might not otherwise obtain a college education and to those in an engineering curriculum.

DR. FRED ELTON STEELE, CLASS OF 1882 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by William W. Steele, Class of 1959 in memory of The Honorable Fred Elton Steele, Sr., M.D., Class of 1882, Trustee of the University from 1907 to 1927 and Vice President of the Board of Trustees from 1921 to 1926. The scholarship is given to a member of the Corps of Cadets of demonstrated good character and financial need. Preference is given to those who might not otherwise obtain a college education and to those in an engineering curriculum.

GOVERNOR WILLIAM W. STICKNEY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1926 by the Honorable William W. Stickney of Ludlow, Vermont.

MONSIGNOR EDWARD J. SUTFIN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1981 by Michael D. Krause in memory of Monsignor Edward J. Sutfin, Dana Professor of Philosophy and University Chaplain. The scholarship is restricted to a cadet who demonstrates an abiding interest in philosophy, religion, and fine arts.

BRIGADIER GENERAL WARREN E. SWEETSER, JR. USMC SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1984 by William Sweetser, Class of 1963, in memory of his father, Brigadier General Warren E. Sweetser, Jr., USMC. This scholarship is awarded to both a junior and senior. Awarded to a junior intending to join the U.S. Marine Corps who expresses honesty, loyalty, and spirit in the Corps of Cadets, who exemplifies compassion for others, and who gives a helping hand to fellow cadets. Awarded to an outstanding senior cadet who will be commissioned in the USMC upon graduation. The student receives a commissioning box containing the paraphernalia necessary for a commissioned officer of the Marine Corps.

JAMES E. TATKO SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1986 by gifts from family, alumni, and friends in memory of James E. Tatko, Class of 1964. Funds are awarded to a senior member of the Corps of Cadets with demonstrated need and who has a GPA of 2.0 or higher.

GARY '81 AND CAROLYN TERRY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by Gary and Carolyn Terry, this scholarship is awarded to a student(s) who are members of the Corps of Cadets, and who demonstrate good character and all-around excellence. This scholarship is renewable through the student's senior year if a 2.5 GPA or greater is maintained.

ARNOLD THAYER, CLASS OF 1876 SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1922 by a gift from Arnold Thayer, Class of 1876, as a general scholarship.

THETA CHI FUND

Established in 1973 by the Theta Chi alumni. Funds are used for scholarships, preferably for descendants of the Alpha Chapter of Theta Chi.

COLONEL FRANK TOMPKINS, D.S.C. SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1985 by an anonymous donor in memory of Colonel Tompkins, a trustee, professor of military science, and Commandant for many years prior to WWII. The recipient will be a member of the Corps of Cadets and a resident of New England who has financial need. Preference is given to residents of Massachusetts.

PAUL W. TOURIGNY '53 SCHOLARSHIP

Established through the estate of Paul W. Tourigny, Class of 1953, this scholarship is awarded to a student(s) entering the Corps of Cadets. The student must have been born in Maine and demonstrate financial need.

JIM AND CAROL (DECKER) '84 TRIHY SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Jim and Carol (Decker), Class of 1984, Trihy, this scholarship is awarded to students who are active members of the Corps of Cadets.

GEORGE AND ANN TURNER SCHOLARSHIP

Established with preference given to a student from Vermont who is majoring in communications. Recipients must demonstrate an interest in sports information. All recipients must demonstrate the attributes so important to George and Ann—character, integrity, and commitment. Awards will be made to students who demonstrate financial need.

USS MONTPELIER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by the proud veterans of the USS Montpelier. Preference will be given to Corps of Cadets students from the Montpelier, Vermont, region who intend to join the United States Navy. If no student fulfills both of the above-stated criteria, the scholarship shall be awarded to either a Corps of Cadets student from the Montpelier region or a Corps of Cadets student who intends to join the United States Navy upon graduation.

DONALD M. WALLACE MECHANICAL ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2018, through a gift from the estate of Donald M. Wallace, a former Mechanical Engineering Professor at Norwich University for 55 years, the scholarship will be awarded to a junior(s) and/or senior(s) student(s) pursuing a degree in Mechanical Engineering, in high academic standing and demonstrated financial need. The donor's intent is to reduce or eliminate the need for work study hours for the recipient(s).

GRACE MORAN WARD SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016 by Eugene W., Class of 1949, and Grace L. Ward, to be awarded to female members of the Corps of Cadets who are enrolled in engineering or science majors. The student(s) selected must maintain a GPA of 3.0 or better and have demonstrated financial need.

PROFESSOR PETER DOW WEBSTER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 by Richard, Class of 1952, and Eleanor McManus in honor of Mr. McManus' mentor, English Professor Peter Dow Webster. Preference is given to juniors and seniors in the Corps of Cadets majoring in English. Eligible students from Essex County, Massachusetts will be given preference. Bachelor of Arts candidates may be considered if there are no English majors. Eligible students need to demonstrate financial need and must exemplify the spirit of community service to Norwich University.

ALAN H. WEISS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016 by the Alan H. Weiss estate. Mr. Weiss, formerly of Northfield, Vermont was a life-long educator and public servant. He served as Director of Continuing Education at Norwich University and was a general in the Partridge Society. This scholarship is to be awarded to a student(s) majoring in nursing with a preference for a student(s) who plan to practice in Vermont for two consecutive years upon graduation. The student who receives this scholarship must demonstrate financial need.

EDWARD S. AND MARY J. WESNESKI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1986, the Edward S. and Mary J. Wesneski Memorial scholarship is awarded to a Corps of Cadets student. The applicants will have a demonstrated financial need. All candidates will have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5. The recipient will be allowed to reapply for the scholarship provided he or she maintains the aforementioned grade point average.

WESTMORELAND SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Westmoreland Scholarship Fund was established in 1972 by the Board of Trustees in honor of the commencement speaker (of that year) General William Westmoreland.

BARBARA AND GEORGE WEY '56 CIVIL ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2014 by Barbara and George Wey, Class of 1956. The donors prefer that this scholarship is awarded to students who are majoring in Civil Engineering and are entering either their junior or senior academic year.

J. WHITE SCHOLARSHIP

Established as a general scholarship to provide assistance to students based on financial need.

BARBARA AND MARILYN. WHITNEY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2001 in memory of his wife by COL Conrad D. Whitney USA (Ret.), Class of 1951. Awards are made annually to members of the Corps of Cadets who are in their junior or senior year, with preference being given to candidates from the State of Connecticut.

CLINTON '29 AND ANNE WHITNEY SCHOLARSHIP

A general scholarship established in 1993 by the estate of Clinton Whitney, Class of 1929.

ROBERT A. '69 AND ERIC A. '11 WILLIAMS SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2007 by Robert A. Williams, Class of 1969, this scholarship is awarded to a member of the Corps of Cadets from Vermont. Preference will be given to those students residing in Orleans County. The student must demonstrate financial need, and this scholarship may be renewed through their senior year.

MG LEONARD F. WING SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1991 by BG Leonard F. Wing, Class of 1945, in memory of his father, MG L Leonard F. Wing, Sr., who served as a member of the Board of Trustees from 1939-1946. The income is used to fund an annual scholarship for a student from Rutland County, Vermont who demonstrates financial need, is in the ROTC program, and maintains a high school GPA of 3.0 or better.

GEORGE '67 AND DIANE WISELL SCHOLARSHIP

Established by George, Class of 1967, and Diane Wisell to be awarded annually to a member of the Corps of Cadets. The student must be entering his or her senior year and enrolled in a major within the School of Business and Management. The student(s) must also reside in one of the following Vermont counties; Addison, Washington, or Chittenden. Second preference will be given to students who live in the U.S. Virgin Islands, or Camden County, Georgia.

COLONEL THOMAS H. AND HALLIE B. WRIGHT SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1999 by Lt. Col Thomas Wright, Jr., Class of 1975, in honor of his father, Thomas, a military and civil rights trailblazer and his mother, Hallie, an educator and civic leader. Awarded to students who demonstrate academic merit and financial need, preference is given to African American upperclassmen in the Corps of Cadets, with priority to students from U.S. military families in New England.
